#### The Snowflake Model

The Snowflake Model provides a fun and meaningful way for people to organize for change with little effort. Successfully implemented, it forms the strong network of like-minded people essential to a movement for change. It allows members to remain anonymous, except to a few trusted friends, while they stay informed.

It begins with a couple of friends identifying others with the same concerns. Together they form a snowflake of up to 8 members. One of them acts as the head of the group. As the group identifies more concerned people, a second snowflake is formed with a member of the first one serving as its head. From the initial snowflake, an endless number of interconnected groups are formed.

The role of the head is to make a monthly personal contact with each member of his or her group. The task is simple. It can be seen as an excuse to stay in touch with friends on a regular basis and to build new friendships. Members of snowflakes will receive by email the latest issue of *The OPERI Recap*. When contacting their snowflake members, heads can confirm that members have received *The Recap* and perhaps draw attention to some item of particular interest. They can also remind people to visit the OPERI Facebook group and scroll down to review items of possible interest that were not included in *The Recap*. Other members of a snowflake have little to do beyond the monthly talk with their head.

In additional to organizing individuals for change, OPERI is working to develop the model as a coalition of groups dedicated to the wellbeing of children. Uniting such groups increases the possibilities for hosting significant events such as conferences and film screenings. It also helps to bring attention to some of the many ways people are working to improve the lives of young people.
